The English/Language Arts Assessment will be administered to Sophomores and begin on 3/27.


The Math Assessment will be administered to Sophomores and begin on April 4.

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
The SM West Junior/Senior prom will be held on Saturday, April 15th at the Hyatt Place on 87th and Renner Road just West of I-435.




WEST READS


SM WEST SENIOR SIZZLE

Free Application Month for Seniors at Emporia State - ESU Admissions has decided to offer a <u>free application</u> for the month of March to any Seniors interested in coming to ESU next year.



KC Scholars <u>Scholarship</u> for 11TH GRADERS up to \$50,000
What are the eligibility requirements for the Traditional Scholarship?
You must meet all of the following requirements to apply:
1.Be a current 11th grader during the application cycle;
2.Be home-schooled or attend a public, charter, or private high school in the following six counties: Cass, Clay, Jackson and Platte (MO) or Johnson and Wyandotte (KS);
3.Be lawfully present in the U.S. or DACA eligible and DACA applied/approved:

4.Have at least a 2.5 cumulative high school unweighted GPA (five semesters from 9th grade to the fall semester of 11th grade) or at least a 16 on the ACT or at least an 800 on the SAT); and

5.Be considered low- or modest-income. Your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) calculation on the <u>Federal Student Aid Estimator</u> must be 12,000 or less. The calculation is based on household income, number of members in the family, and number of family members that will be in college at the same time. This is the amount of annual financial support a family can be expected to pay toward the student's college education.

How can I apply for the scholarship?

KC Scholars College Savings Match for 9TH GRADERS up to \$1,400

Students with 529 College Savings Plans are four times more likely to complete college. Begin saving and planning for college and your path to a more financially secure future.

KC Scholars Adult Learner Scholarship for Adults up to \$50,000

There are 281,000 adults with some college and no degree, and 96,000 with an associate's but not bachelor's degree in the six counties that KC Scholars serves. Many of these adults believe they will never have the opportunity to return to and complete their degrees. KC Scholars provides that opportunity. The Adult Learner scholarships are eligible for adults (18+) with a high school diploma or equivalent, or to adults with associates degrees looking to complete a bachelors. Adult learners can receive up to \$10,000 per year for up to five years and can enroll full-time or part-time.

Keeping our Students Healthy

• If your child has an injury like a sprained ankle please be sure to let the Nurses Office know. You can call or email or drop of any discharge paperwork with recommendations.

This will help us to communicate with teachers and make accommodations if needed. We want our students to be safe getting around the school!

 If your child takes a medication as needed for asthma, anxiety, stomach issues etc. and they would like to be able to take these at school—we are happy to keep a supply in the Nurses Office! We just ask that the medication be in a labeled prescription bottle. If needed you can ask the pharmacy to give you an empty labeled bottle for school—they can do this free of charge.



- Again, if your child has been diagnosed or tested positive for Covid or Influenza A or B they need to remain at home for 5 days. They may return on Day 6 and are encouraged to wear a mask for 5 days while in school.

MACBOOK/IT - IMPORTANT

An update was pushed out to all devices, requiring all devices to be updated to *13.2.1.* **It is essential that all devices are updated before March 2nd.** If your device is not updated by March 2nd, then you will be guarantined until the update is completed.



If you need guidance on how to update your device, then please follow the steps in the <u>Update</u> <u>to Ventura Document</u> (thank you Mrs. Stowers) or the <u>ICT Software Updating document.</u> If you are still experiencing issues, then please put in a ticket.

 - The screens to the new devices are very delicate. Please remind students not to pick up the device by the screen and do not close the device with something in it.

ICT Updates

We want to remind you of a few things now that we are back in the swing of the school year:

- 1. Your MacBook must have the district issued case on it at all times. (Failure to have the cover in place will result in confiscation of the MacBook.)
- 2. Please only carry your MacBook with the screen shut and with both hands to keep the machine secure.
- 3. Do not ever pick up the MacBook by the screen. The LCD is very sensitive and the pressure of your grip will break the screen.
- 4. Keyboard covers should not be used since non-Apple keyboard covers might be too large and can put pressure on the screens and cause damage.
- 5. Please don't leave your MacBook in a car overnight.
- 6. Needed programs can be found on Manager. You will not be able to download programs from the App Store for use on these devices.
- 7. Downloading VPNs (Virtual Private Networks) or other programs that mask your device on the network are a violation of the Responsible Use Policy you have agreed to. Use of these will result in the confiscation of the MacBook and you may MacBook access for the semester/school year for consistent violations.
- 8. Due to the MacBook refresh this summer and the cost of the new hardware, the replacement device cost has gone up. Although, the charger cost has dropped. The incident fees have stayed the same (fees reset in high school).
 - 1. 1st Incident/Damaged Device fee: \$100.00
 - 2. 2nd Incident/Damaged Device fee: \$150.00
 - 3. 3rd and Subsequent Incident/Damage Device fee: Actual cost of repair/replacement or \$300.00 whichever is greater.
 - 4. Apple MacBook Air M1 USB-C Cable Replacement \$19
 - 5. Apple MacBook Air M1 Charger Replacement \$39
 - 6. Apple MacBook Air M1 Adapter Set Replacement \$58
 - 7. Apple MacBook Air M1 Replacement/Lost Device fee \$1,117.95
- 9. If you ever need help or support with your device, please review our Tech Rescue Page (<u>https://sites.google.com/smsd.org/smwtechrescue/tech-issues</u>). If you are still experiencing issues, then you can submit a Web Help Desk Ticket (<u>https://support.smsd.org</u>).


Tired of being stuck at home with your old books? Ready for a spring refresh? Bring a stack of books,

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT FORUM

Spring 2023 is the 61st year of the Shawnee Mission School District's Research and Development (R&D) Forum. This year's forum will feature a **Student Showcase** and a live-streamed **Pitch Finals competition** at the Center for Academic Achievement. **Pitch Finals Competition- Info Session on Feb. 2**



A pitch competition for student innovators will be offered as part of the district's annual R&D Forum. Not only can students win cash prizes for their Next Great Idea, but they can also receive additional funding to advance their idea.

An informational session will be held virtually:

- Time, Date, Place: Webex, at 6 p.m. on February 2
- Who can enter: Any interested student, grades K-12
- What: Learn more about the process.
- How to join: A link to the informational session can be found here.

• How to apply: Application information can be found on the <u>R&D webpage</u>. The deadline to apply for the pitch competition is Friday, March 3, 2023. Practice sessions with industry mentors will be scheduled for students who apply to compete.

Final Competition and Prizes:

Applicants chosen as finalists will pitch their Next Great Idea to a panel of judges during the morning of April 29, 2023, at the Center for Academic Achievement, 8200 W. 71st St. The pitch competition will be live streamed so friends and family can participate as well. Top awards are \$2,500, of which \$1,000 is a cash award to be used by the winner to pursue their passion and education and up to \$1,500 will be awarded as "build it" grants to support making the winner's pitch a reality. A People's Choice category, determined by public voters, will be awarded a \$500 prize. There will also be an Idea of Promise award with a prize of \$500.

Student Showcase:

The R&D Forum student showcase, with display-only and competitive exhibits will be held in Spring 2023. Students, families, and staff members are encouraged to enter student-created projects, experiments, or art projects to share in this districtwide event. All submissions must be registered and information on how to register can be found <u>online</u>. The deadline to register for the showcase is **Friday, March 24, 2023**.

Sporadic absences, not just those on consecutive days of school, matter. Before you know it

- just one or two dows a month can add un to nearly 10 percent of the school year

• If too many absences occur, it is still a problem whether they are excused or unexcused because they represent too much lost learning time in the classroom.

We appreciate our students, parents, staff and community helping to prioritize the importance of coming to school and then making sure to arrive on time to each class throughout the day.





MESSAGE FROM FOOD SERVICE

We want all of our students at SM West to be able to eat a good breakfast and lunch. Please read the information below from Food Services. Students are free to bring a sack lunch to school, but no fast food items should be brought into the building.

SM West does not have an open lunch policy except for Seniors whose parents have completed the permission form link. (An email was sent to all senior parents from Jennifer Silverstein with the link). Open Lunch for seniors will not begin until after ID cards have been distributed. Tentatively after Labor Day.

22 - 23 School Meals

Food Service will continue to offer healthy and appealing breakfast and lunch options for all students this school year. Unfortunately, the USDA nationwide waivers allowing for free school meals for all students concluded with the end of the 2021 - 22 school year.

The meal prices of 2022 - 23 are below . Breakfast at the High School \$1.65 Lunch at the High School \$3.00

Families will be able to complete a child nutrition meal benefit application to see if they qualify for free or reduced priced meals. The information and link regarding the meal benefit application will be a part of the parent online verification process as well as be available on the <u>Food Service web</u>.

Families are encouraged to check their student's current food service account balance on School Café -<u>https://www.schoolcafe.com/SHAWNEEMISSION</u> . Payments to a student's food service account can be done by check or cash at the school, credit card online through e Funds (\$3 fee) or by calling the Food Service office 993-9710 (no fee). Student account balances (positive or negative) do roll over to the next year – even if the student switches schools within the district.

Food Service will continue to follow the procedure of serving students a full breakfast or a full lunch regardless of the money they have in their account. During the 2022 - 23 school year, when a student's account is low or in the negative, notifications will be made to parents. When an account is -\$75.00, the parent/guardian will receive a notification that if the account is not paid it will be turned over to the collection agency. Students will not be permitted to purchase ala carte items if their account is negative.




A snack is provided for all of those attending. Bus transportation is also provided. The bus is able to make stops along the 87th street corridor.



TRANSPORTATION UPDATE -SIGN UP FOR TEXT NOTIFICATIONS

In the event there are times throughout the year when routes are running late and


Parking is \$50 for the year.




The circled spots on the map are where students can park.
