Students need to stay in their class until the pass is delivered to them.





SMSD Vaccination Clinics

The Shawnee Mission School District (SMSD) is working with community partners to host FREE vaccination clinics in our schools.

- All clinics offer 1st doses, 2nd doses, and boosters to individuals 5 years old and up.
- Pfizer, Moderna, and Johnson and Johnson will be available at each clinic as supplies are available.
- Clinics are open to SMSD students and their family members, and SMSD staff and their family members. Clinics are also advertised publicly and community members may attend.
- If you have it, please bring your insurance card, driver's license/proof of address, and COVID vaccination card (for Dose 2 and boosters).
- If you forget your vaccination card, another one will be provided to you.
- Remember to wear clothing that allows access to the upper arm/shoulder.
- Parents are required to attend and provide consent for vaccination.






Booster Club

NOTE FROM OUR NURSE

Free COVID testing thru SMSD:

SMSD continues to offer FREE testing for students, staff and their families. This is for anyone feeling unwell or with a known exposure. Please call the nurse at 913-993-7816 if you have symptoms, have been exposed to COVID, or have questions about testing. The test site has moved to 6701 W. 83rd Street (the Early Childhood Education Center); call 913-993-6218 for an appointment.



***PCR testing is the only type of testing that is accepted by SMSD for returning to school if you have felt ill or have been exposed to COVID. <u>Home test kits and rapid or antigen test results are not accepted for return to school after illness or exposure</u>.

Free COVID testing for anyone:

Anyone can get a FREE test for ANY reason (travel, just to check, etc.) thru this site: https://www.coronavirus.kdheks.gov/280/COVID-19-Testing. Please note that gogettested.com no longer has any test sites in Kansas, but there are plenty of other locations (including Jo Co Community College) available.

Feeling under the weather?

It is very important that people who have NEW symptoms of COVID-like illness stay home. As a refresher, here are the symptoms: https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/symptoms-testing/symptoms.html. Please note that many recent cases of COVID here at West do not involve a fever or cough. Stay home even if you think it's "just a cold." It is always best to test. This is critical for limiting the spread of COVID. Stay home when you don't feel well. Call the nurse 913-993-7816 (we need to track numbers!) and test. It is always best to test.

Dear Parent,

Your student is being invited to participate in a web-based online survey on sport specialization and its associated outcomes. It should take your student approximately 10 minutes to complete. PARTICIPATION

Your student's participation in this survey is voluntary. You may refuse to allow your student to participate in the research, or your student may exit the survey at any time without penalty. Your student is free to decline to answer any particular question they do not wish to answer for any reason.

BENEFITS

Your student will receive no direct benefits from participating in this research study. However, your student's responses may help us learn more about the effects of early sports specialization and how it compares to various psychological outcomes, physical injuries, and other medical complications. RISKS

There are no foreseeable risks involved in participating in this study other than those encountered in day-to-day life.

CONFIDENTIALITY

Your student's survey answers will be sent to a link at REDCap where data will be stored in a password protected electronic format. REDCap does not collect identifying information such as your student's name, email address, or IP address. Coaches, athletic trainers, teammates, or any school personnel will NOT have access to any of your student's responses. No personally identifiable information (name, birthday, address, etc.) will be collected, ensuring that your student's responses are unidentifiable. If any combination of the data makes your responses identifiable, they will not be reported when the study team publishes.



A LA CARTE PURCHASE IN SCHOOL CAFETERIA

Each student may receive one breakfast and one lunch meal for free each day. Students may purchase additional food & beverages ala carte such as an extra slice of pizza but the student must have money on their account or cash in hand to purchase ala carte items. Students will not be allowed to charge ala carte items. Parents can use School Café to set low account balances, set limits for ala carte purchases and more. 



Health Partnership Clinic Open at SM West

A school-based health clinic for all Shawnee Mission School District students and their siblings (3 to 20 years old) SM West High School, 8800 W. 85th St.

The clinic will be open from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Thursdays, except when school is not in session.

Health Partnership Clinic (HPC) and the Shawnee Mission School District are partnering to provide access to primary and preventative health care, chronic disease management, mental health services, and dental care to district students and their siblings.

For more information about the Health Partnership Clinic, or to schedule a medical appointment, Shawnee Mission School District parents should call 913-648-2266. More information also is available here.

Services will include:

Physical exams

Sports physicals

Immunizations, including vaccines for COVID-19

COVID testing

Age-appropriate health screenings

Preventative education

Referrals to specialty services

Sick visits

Management of acute and chronic problems and mental health services

Dental Care including screenings, fluorides, and restorative care

Most insurance plans are accepted, including

KanCare/Medicaid. As a community health center, HPC offers a sliding-fee discount program which is based on income and household size. Fees are waived for students experiencing homelessness. Free medicaid and Marketplace insurance enrollment will also be available.

"The idea is to break down barriers to health care," Shelby Rebeck, health services director for the Shawnee Mission School District shared. "Barriers for many of our students include low income, lack of knowledge, lack of transportation and parents'/guardians' inability to take time away from hourly jobs. Health Partnership provides a tremendous opportunity for our students to receive critical health care so they can be successful in school."

The clinic offers pediatric-focused care to treat most health conditions that affect children and adolescents, Amy Falk,

"We basically function as a doctor's office, but in a school building," Falk noted. "Services are available in person or virtual, and walk-ins will be accommodated if the schedule permits. The primary goal is to provide easy, immediate access to quality and affordable health care."

The goal is to serve as a medical home for students and offer an additional access point to primary care, Wael S. Mourad, MD, MHCM, FAAFP, and HPC's chief health officer, shared. "Beyond a focus on primary health care, it is important we meet the social and emotional needs of children and adolescents to help them reach their individual potential," Mourad added.

The clinic will open across from the nurse's office at SM West. "The Shawnee Mission School District and Health Partnership Clinic are an example of how two organizations can come together to help improve the lives of children," says Steve Loe, principal of Shawnee Mission West High School. "The school-based health clinic will greatly expand the resources of our school nurse and social worker and help support our goal to have every student succeed."

Covid and Masking Update

Our nation and community continue to deal with the effects and repercussions of the Covid-19 Pandemic. The goal of our SMSD Board of Education is to keep students in school. The School Board recently had an emergency session to vote on the use of masks in school. Here is the announcement from this meeting:

Shawnee Mission Board of Education Approves Updated Mitigation Plan

At the August 5, 2021, special meeting of the Shawnee Mission School District Board of Education, the Board approved changes to the COVID-19 mitigation plan.

These changes will require all children and adults in grades PreK-12 to wear masks in all district facilities.

The details of the approved plan are included here:

<u>Handout, plan approved on Aug. 5, 2021</u>

The vote passed with a 6 to 1 vote in favor. Keeping schools open and safe continues to be a top priority in the SMSD in the 2021-2022 school year.

- In order to keep all students and staff safe at school please help us with the following:
- Report all positive cases of COVID-19 to the school nurse.
- Keep your student home when they are ill and get a PCR test.
- PCR Testing SMSD only accepts PCR COVID tests
 SMSD offers free PCR testing Monday- Friday 8am-4pm when school is in session by calling 913-993-6218
- o Free PCR testing is also offered at community testing sites such as www.gogettested.com/kansas, CVS, Walgreens, etc.
- If you or your student have a known exposure to a positive case of COVID-19 outside of school/school related activity, please contact JCDHE at 913-715-2819 for instructions.

Due to high community transmission rates of COVID-19 in the county and lack of vaccine availability for all individuals, the Shawnee Mission School District (SMSD) will require masking of all children and adults in grades PreK-12 and in all district facilities until further notice.

MASKING:

Masks are required for all PreK-12 children and adults until such a time as all students have the opportunity to be fully vaccinated and community transmission levels decrease.

*Individuals do not need to mask when outdoors. This includes students participating in elementary recess.



VACCINATIONS:

It is recommended that all eligible individuals receive the COVID-19 vaccination. Vaccination has proven to be the most effective means for individual protection against COVID-19 and in halting the transmission of COVID-19. It is strongly recommended that unvaccinated individuals continue to mask until fully vaccinated (2 weeks after the last dose in series).



EXCLUSION:

Fully vaccinated individuals will not be quarantined with an exposure unless they are/become symptomatic. COVID-19 positive individuals will be excluded from school/activities for 10 days and 24 hour symptom improvement.

Food Service welcomes every student to enjoy FREE school breakfast and lunch for the 2021-22 school year.

Once again, the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) has put into effect nationwide waivers allowing school

food service departments to continue to serve healthy school meal options free to all students.

There are no Free & Reduced Meal Applications for 2021-22 school year since meals are FREE for all students.

Families are encouraged to complete a Household Economic Survey (HES) as part of the Parent Online Verification available on Skyward sometime in July. The purpose of the HES form is to assist families and our district in the upcoming year.

- Even though all students will be able to eat breakfast and lunch at no cost this year, the HES form generates additional state funds for our schools.
- If your family qualifies, the district will receive funds to help support programs providing additional support for learners with a variety of needs.
- Additionally, qualifying on the HES provides other benefits to families which may include free/reduced transportation fees and preK enrollment. If families do not complete the HES, State funding for our school district may be reduced.
- Do not complete the HES form if you are Directly Certified to receive free meals. If you receive state assistance, call the SMSD Food Service office before completing the HES form.

Eligibility determination will be made according to the guidelines established by the Kansas Department of Education. Please contact the SMSD Food Service office with any questions.
