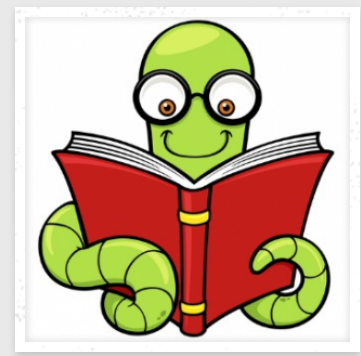

You are invited to apply for the Holiday Shop - December 2-10th, 2022



If you are a Johnson County, Kansas resident struggling to keep food on the table and pay bills, you may apply for an appointment to visit our Holiday Shop to receive food and gifts. (You may only apply to receive help from one agency.)

APPLY ONLINE Please apply online at www.jccb.org. Computers are available to use at no charge at most libraries. Email or call if you need help applying. **Do not apply twice.** You may receive more than one invitation to apply. Fill out only one application, it will slow down your approval if you fill out two applications.

Due to the changing COVID pandemic, we may have to change to an alternate shop for pick-up of your items instead of shopping for them. The application still needs to be filled out. You will be given an appointment time to pick up your food and gifts whether you are shopping or do drive-up.

APPOINTMENTS SENT VIA EMAIL Please check your email. If you do not have email you will receive a letter by mail. Appointment scheduling begins in mid-October.

MERCHANDISE SELECTION If approved you may pick out groceries, gifts, toys, personal care items, coats, children/teen clothing and books for your household. We cannot distribute more than is donated each year. Please understand that we cannot let you shop for individuals who are not members of your household. Only those people living in your household full-time may be included on your application. If COVID conditions require us to change to an alternate pick-up plan, some merchandise departments may be excluded from the package of items distributed.

ONE HOUSEHOLD MEMBER MAY SHOP One member of your household will select merchandise for the entire household. If more than one family lives in the same household, please list all household members on one application. If you need to bring your children, please bring someone to watch them. Only babies or toddlers may ride in the cart with you to shop.

We ask for a voluntary donation if you can afford one (from \$3-\$10 depending on household size). This donation is not required.

By submitting an application, you give JCCB permission to verify all information and to verify your eligibility. JCCB has the right to use and retain all information. JCCB reserves the right to reject any application for any and/or no reason in our sole and exclusive discretion. Submission of an application does not guarantee an appointment.

MESSAGE FROM FOOD SERVICE



We want all of our students at SM West to be able to eat a good breakfast and lunch. Please read the information below from Food Services. Students are free to bring a sack lunch to school, but no fast food items should be brought into the building.

SM West does not have an open lunch policy except for Seniors whose parents have completed the permission form link. (An email was sent to all senior parents from Jennifer Silverstein with the link). Open Lunch for seniors will not begin until after ID cards have been distributed. Tentatively after Labor Day.

22 - 23 School Meals

Food Service will continue to offer healthy and appealing breakfast and lunch options for all students this school year. Unfortunately, the USDA nationwide waivers allowing for free school meals for all students concluded with the end of the 2021 - 22 school year.

The meal prices of 2022 - 23 are below .

Breakfast at the High School \$1.65

Lunch at the High School \$3.00

Families will be able to complete a child nutrition meal benefit application to see if they qualify for free or reduced priced meals. The information and link regarding the meal benefit application will be a part of the parent online verification process as well as be available on the [Food Service web](#) .

Families are encouraged to check their student's current food service account balance on School Café - <https://www.schoolcafe.com/SHAWNEEMISSION> . Payments to a student's food service account can be done by check or cash at the school, credit card online through e Funds (\$3 fee) or by calling the Food Service office 993-9710 (no fee). Student account balances (positive or negative) do roll over to the next year – even if the student switches schools within the district.

Food Service will continue to follow the procedure of serving students a full breakfast or a full lunch regardless of the money they have in their account. During the 2022 - 23 school year, when a student's account is low or in the negative, notifications will be made to parents. When an account is - \$75.00, the parent/guardian will receive a notification that if the account is not paid it will be turned over to the collection agency. Students will not be permitted to purchase ala carte items if their account is negative.

FENTANYL AWARENESS

This article originated in another school's newsletter, but it has some great information on the dangers of Fentanyl. Our PTSA is having a guest speaker at their November 14th meeting that will talk about this current issue. This resource is a good reminder and introduction to this dangerous trend.

What's Happening

Deaths from fake pills with fentanyl are surging across the country and right here in our own school district. In the past 18 months, we've lost several students to fentanyl-related poisonings — teenagers who had hopes and dreams and plans. These teenagers had families who loved them and are still coming to grips with their losses.

Teens are purchasing what they think are OxyContin, Percoset or Xanax pills via social media, but drug dealers are making these fake pills with the cheaper, stronger and more deadly synthetic drug called fentanyl to increase their profits. Fentanyl is up to 50 times more potent than heroin and 100 times more potent than morphine. Fentanyl is odorless, tasteless and colorless. Teens never know what they're getting. One pill can kill them. One pill.

The pills are nicknamed "Blues" for their common color (though they can come in other colors) or "M30s" for the stamp on the pills. The tablets are so well made that even experienced users say that they can't tell the difference between a counterfeit pill and a pill manufactured by a pharmaceutical company. To be clear, these are not pharmaceutical-grade painkillers; they are pills made by drug dealers, mostly outside the country. There is no quality control. Pills in the same batch can have wildly varying levels of fentanyl. The amount of fentanyl it takes to overdose and die is equivalent to two grains of sand.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued a [health alert](#) in December 2020 because of an increase in synthetic opioids that hit the western United States — and the Interstate 5 corridor, in particular. Already this year in Washington County, the Westside Interagency Narcotics Team has seized more than 17,000 pills with most suspected as counterfeit "M30" Oxycodone pills. In all of 2020, the team seized fewer than 14,000 pills. Learn more about the [regional crisis](#).

Local investigators point to advertisements on social media platforms like Snapchat. Officials say that young people find pills especially appealing because they're cheap, more socially

acceptable than meth or heroin and don't have a tell-tale smell like alcohol or marijuana.

Investigators have recently noted that the use of pills laced with fentanyl has diminished somewhat and has shifted to more "colorful" powdered methods to attract youth.

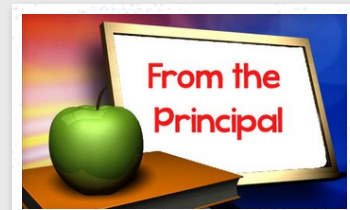
We need some help from our students and parents.

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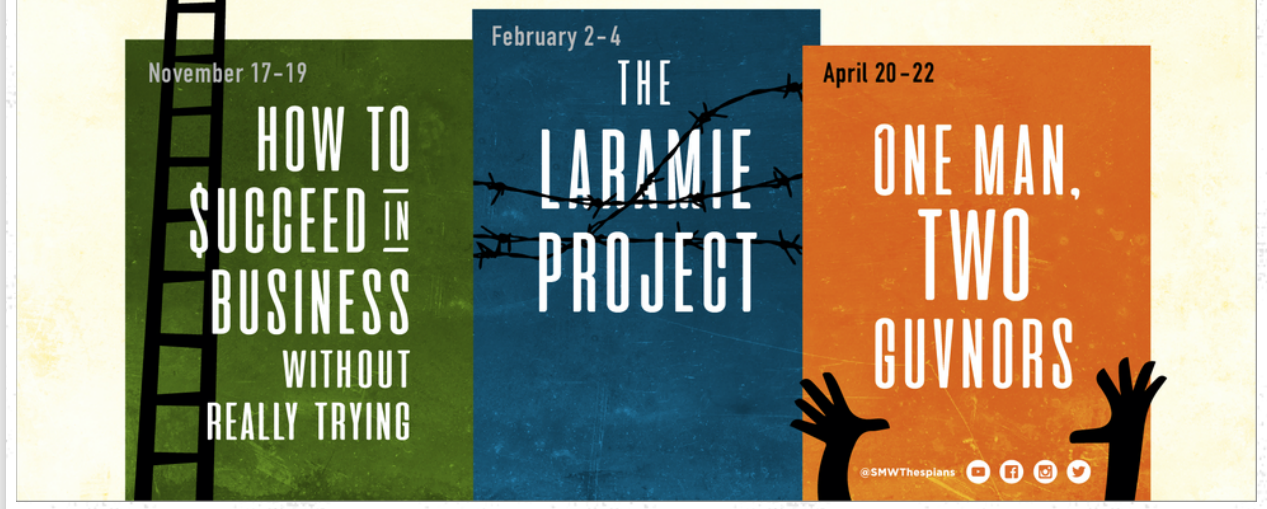

TRANSPORTATION UPDATE - SIGN UP FOR TEXT NOTIFICATIONS

In the event there are times throughout the year when routes are running late and

notification is needed at the school and family level, we want to encourage you to sign up for Textcaster notifications. We have previously pushed a number of communications about this to

families via school newsletters (with your assistance) as well as through district communications reminding of the availability to sign up for text notifications when routes are running late *or compressed with other buses*. **We encourage you to also sign up to receive text notifications as it is the fastest way to provide notice of any changes.**

Immunizations!

If your student is 16 years old, they will need an immunization. A second dose of Meningococcal vaccine—also known as Menactra or Menveo is due.

A word to the wise, don't wait to have this done. The official due date is October 13th!!

Students who don't have immunizations done on time will need to be sent home until the immunization is given and documentation given to the Nurse Office.

I wanted to reach out to let you know that this year we have some new guidelines for Covid that are a little different than last year.

This year the CDC no longer recommends that students quarantine or stay home from school due to Covid exposure. However, should your student begin to have symptoms and test positive then they would need to remain home.

- If students test positive—Day 0 is test day and then they are out for 5 days
- Day 6—may return if no ongoing symptoms and no fever in the previous 24 hours
- Day 6-10—highly recommended and encouraged to mask

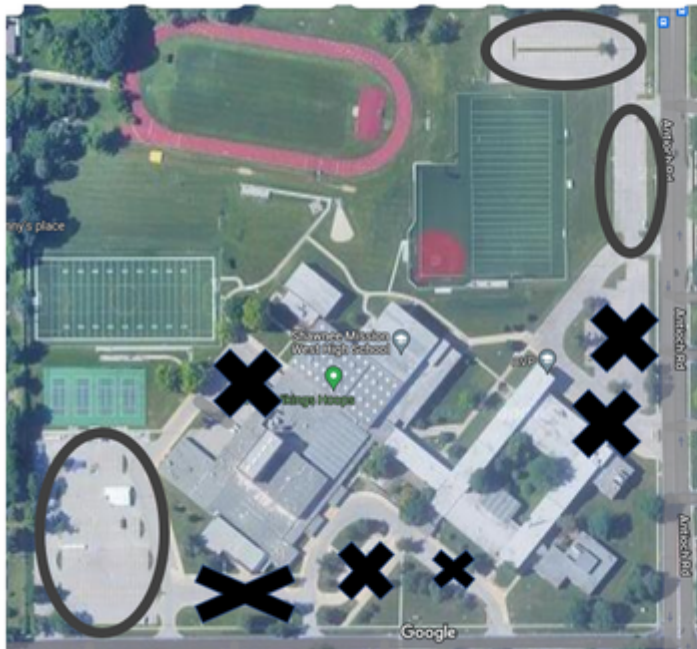
PARKING PERMITS
