



### HOMECOMING



School Wide Positive Behavior Supports (SWPBS) is a research based systemic approach at handling behavior by being proactive. At West High School we call this "The West Way." Through this model we first teach our expectations of Safe, Respectful, and Responsible behaviors in various settings. By being proactive in our attempts to ensure a safe and comfortable environment in which students can learn, we avoid making assumptions of what students know by teaching and modeling the expected behaviors consistently throughout West and at all West activities and events. ## **Suicide Prevention**

Suicide is an international problem and a major public health concern. Suicide claims approximately 1 million lives worldwide each year, resulting in one suicide every 40 seconds. There is an estimated 10 to 20 suicide attempts per each completed suicide, resulting in several million suicide attempts each year.

Risk factors remain essentially the same from country to country. Mental illness, substance abuse, previous suicide attempts, hopelessness, access to lethal means, recent loss of loved ones, unemployment and vulnerability to self-harm are just a few examples of risk factors.

Protective factors are also the same in all corners of the world. High self-esteem, social connectedness, problem-solving skills, supportive family and friends are all examples of factors that buffer against suicide and suicidal behaviors.

### **Warning Signs**

- Increased substance use (alcohol or drug)
- No reason for living; no sense of purpose in life
- Anxiety, agitation, unable to sleep or sleeping all of the time
   Feeling trapped like there's no way out
   Withdrawal from friends, family and society
- Rage, uncontrolled anger, seeking revenge
   Acting reckless or engaging in risky activities, seemingly without thinking

#### Ways to start a conversation about suicide:

- I have been feeling concerned about you lately.
- · Recently, I have noticed some differences in you and wondered how you are doing.
- · I wanted to check in with you because you haven't seemed yourself lately.

#### Questions you can ask:

- · Did something happen that made you start feeling this way?
- . How can I best support you right
- · Have you thought about getting help?



#### What you can say that helps:

- · You are not alone in this. I'm here for you.
- . I may not be able to understand exactly how you feel, but I care about you and want to help.

#### Ask the question directly!

- Are you thinking about killing yourself?
- . Have you had thoughts of suicide?

## Ways to Help

### DO

- . Be aware. Learn the warning signs.
- · Get involved. Become available.
- Show interest and support.
- · Ask if he/she is thinking about
- · Be direct. Talk openly and freely about suicide.
- · Be willing to listen. Allow for expression of feelings. Accept the
- · Offer hope that alternatives are available.
- · Reach out.

### DON'T

- . Dare him/her to do it.
- · Give advice by making decisions for someone else to tell them to behave differently.
- · Ask 'why'. This encourages defensiveness.
- · Offer sympathy.
- · Act shocked. This creates distance.
- · Be sworn to secrecy. Seek support.
- Offer reassurance; it only proves you don't understand.
- · Be judgmental. Don't debate whether suicide is right or wrong, or feelings are good or bad. Don't lecture on the value of life.





A word to the wise, don't wait to have this done. The official due date is October 13th!!

Students who don't have immunizations done on time will need to be sent home until the immunization is given and documentation given to the Nurse Office.

I wanted to reach out to let you know that this year we have some new guidelines for Covid that are a little different than last year.

This year the CDC no longer recommends that students quarantine or stay home from school due to Covid exposure. However, should your student begin to have symptoms and test positive then they would need to remain home.

- If students test positive—Day 0 is test day and then they are out for 5 days
- Day 6-may return if no ongoing symptoms and no fever in the previous 24 hours
- Day 6-10—highly recommended and encouraged to mask

## MESSAGE FROM FOOD SERVICE

We want all of our students at SM West to be able to eat a good breakfast and lunch. Please read the information below from Food Services. Students are free to bring a sack lunch to school, but no fast food items should be brought into the building. SM West does not have an open lunch policy except for Seniors



whose parents have completed the permission form link. (An email was sent to all senior parents from Jennifer Silverstein with the link). Open Lunch for seniors will not begin until after ID cards have been distributed. Tentatively after Labor Day.

### 22 - 23 School Meals

Food Service will continue to offer healthy and appealing breakfast and lunch options for all students this school year. Unfortunately, the USDA nationwide waivers allowing for free school meals for all students concluded with the end of the 2021 - 22 school year.

The meal prices of 2022 - 23 are below . Breakfast at the High School \$1.65 Lunch at the High School \$3.00 Families will be able to complete a child nutrition meal benefit application to see if they qualify for free or reduced priced meals. The information and link regarding the meal benefit application will be a part of the parent online verification process as well as be available on the Food Service web.

Families are encouraged to check their student's current food service account balance on School Café - <a href="https://www.schoolcafe.com/SHAWNEEMISSION">https://www.schoolcafe.com/SHAWNEEMISSION</a>. Payments to a student's food service account can be done by check or cash at the school, credit card online through e Funds (\$3 fee) or by calling the Food Service office 993-9710 (no fee). Student account balances (positive or negative) do roll over to the next year – even if the student switches schools within the district.

Food Service will continue to follow the procedure of serving students a full breakfast or a full lunch regardless of the money they have in their account. During the 2022 - 23 school year, when a student's account is low or in the negative, notifications will be made to parents. When an account is - \$75.00, the parent/guardian will receive a notification that if the account is not paid it will be turned over to the collection agency. Students will not be permitted to purchase ala carte items if their account is negative.


Parking is \$50 for the year.




The circled spots on the map are where students can park.
